

A tie in the highest ranking *Challenges*: *Better classroom facilities. Too few people doing the majority of the work* or the need for more volunteers.

To address Challenge #1, inadequate classroom facilities, we are asking for a few volunteers with interest and some experience in the following fields: commercial real estate, architecture, law, American's with Disabilities Act and related fields to gather together and come up with ideas to meet this challenge. OLLI BOARD MINUTES, AUGUST 15, 2012

The August 15 OLLI Board meeting was called to order by President **Pam McGovern**. The June 15 minutes were approved. **Pam, Julie Hume and Tanya Zabalegui** will form a small committee to investigate how OLLI can find better facilities -- the first goal of the Focus Group concerns.

The financial reports, prepared by Treasurer **Sherri Nussbaum**, for July and the end of year were approved. There is a \$16,000 surplus.

Pat Linehan, VP/Adm. announced that new members will be sent a welcoming email informing them to pick up their name tag at the office. Revised pages of the Policies, Procedures& Planning Manual were given to each board member.

Jan Elbaum, VP/Membership announced that the New Member Coffee will be held on Friday, Sept. 21 in the Onken classroom.

VP/ Programs, **Jessie Tromberg** recommends a Friday-at-Four social event at the UClub with \$4.00/ wine, tea and cookies. Travel talks will continue on Sept. 15, Oct. 13 and Nov. 3.

Joann Burch, Dir/Communications announced that the 30 second Public Service announcement is finished and will be used for marketing.

Leah Jordan, Dir/ Volunteer Developmnt, reported there were 32 new attendees at the Open House – did they enroll?

Julie Hume, Dir/Special Projects, stated that the Chancellor will speak at the University Forum on Nov. 28, not Oct. 24.

The office reported that OLLI has 481 members so far this year, 156 of whom enrolled online. OLLI will soon have an internet upgrade that is faster and wireless. The AC problem is being resolved. **Tanya Za-balegui**, UCI Liaison, plans to organize an Open House for UCI faculty as a way to increase OLLI awareness on campus. Plans for an OLLI Fifteenth Anniversary celebration were discussed.







This is the latest entry in for "mature" audiences only. In fact, the newspaper listing guide stars each movie time with a 21+ before each show time. LIBRARY EXPLORATION

Have you explored the OLLI library holdings? Our new board member (**Joann Burch**—Director of Communications) reviewed *European History and European Lives*—1715-1914:

In 36 thirty-minute CDs, Professor Jonathan Steinberg uses biographies of great historical figures to explain how the Old World of lord and serf, horse and carriage, superstition and disease turned into the Modern World of boss and worker, steam and steel, science and medicine. By describing the lives of kings and queens, generals and artists, thinkers and entrepreneurs, Professor Steinberg presents a fascinating timeline of European history from 1715-1914.

The first half covers the years 1715-1815, from the end of Louis XIV's attempt to dominate Europe to Napoleon's defeat plus the introduction of the concept of liberty, equality, and fraternity. The second half covers the years 1815-1914 including the Industrial Revolution with its explosion of science and technology. Among the featured biographies are Charles Darwin, Louis Pasteur, Queen Victoria (who slowly gave up her royal powers, resulting in the democratization of English life) and other personalities bringing in the modern era.

This was an interesting approach to the study of history although there were gaps in the knowledge I acquired. What I liked about Steinberg's approach were the comparisons he made: Robespierre and Osama bin Laden both needed to control ideas and attempted to keep out what they considered evil influences; Nathan Rothschild was the Ross Perot or Sam Walton of the 1800s; Jean Jacques Rousseau was the first to ask, a generation before the U.S. Constitution was drafted, what is the meaning of democracy and the "will" of the people?"


